Kim is currently serves as the Trails and Greenways Program Coordinator for the CTDEEP Bureau


of Outdoor Recreation Division of State Parks and Public Outreach.

The average Salem voter turnout for the national elections (2016 and 2020) was 88.1% compared to the national average of 68%. The average Salem voter turnout for the State of Connecticut elections (2018 and 2022) was 71.2% compared to the State average of 70.3%. The average Salem voter turnout for the municipal elections (2017, 2019, and 2021) was 45%. *More than half of the registered Salem voters did not vote. In the 2021 municipal election a little less than half (approximately 49%) of the registered Democratic voters did not vote.* (approximately 420 did not vote out of the total of the approximately 850 registered Democratic voters).

Your vote counts especially in the municipal elections. The candidates you vote for at the municipal level make decisions that directly affect you and your family. Remember Democrats that don't vote elect Republicans.

A bill discount will be available for residential electric customers starting in December 2023.

You must have financial hardship status on your electric account. If you do, there are two tiers of discount depending on your annual household income or receipt of a public assistance benefit.

#### Eligible income for 10% Discount Rate

To qualify, your household annual income for all adults over 18 must be at or below 60% of the state median income, or you can show receipt of a public assistance benefit for at least one household member.






